Get prepared to sit for the NCLEX exam

When you complete your ABSN degree, you'll be eligible to take the National Council Licensure Exam (NCLEX) to become licensed as a registered nurse (RN). The NCLEX assesses your knowledge of core nursing concepts and your ability to think critically and problem-solve in the field. At UB, we'll prepare you with the skills and clinical experiences you need for success on the exam.

Admission requirements

- Complete the application for enrollment at bridgeport.edu/apply.
- · Submit transcripts.
 - Submit proof of high school completion or its equivalent.
 - Submit transcripts from all colleges/universities attended (transfer applicants).
- Students must have a minimum cumulative GPA of 3.0.
- Submit a personal essay of approximately 500 words.
- Submit two completed recommendation forms.
 - Please review the recommendation form for specifics. Each recommendation form must be placed in a sealed envelope with the referrer's signature across the closure.

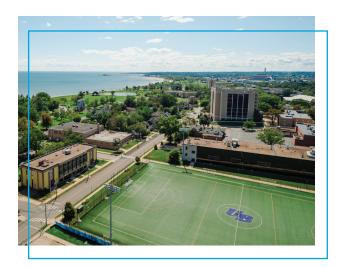
