Dr. Linda Wagner, Executive Director of the School of Nursing, has been in leadership roles at University of Bridgeport since 2015. She started as Associate Dean for the RN-BSN program and then provided program leadership as the Associate Director for BSN when it began in 2017.

Dr. Wagner has over 30 years of experience teaching undergraduate and graduate nursing students. Her clinical background is in child health. Over the years, she has facilitated several community engagement activities, as well as partnerships in the community and local school systems. She has presented her research at the national and international levels on stigma tool development and stigma in Sickle Cell Disease, as well as other studies on transitions and vulnerable populations. Other areas of research include leadership development for nursing students and the outcomes of taking nursing students on global health experiences. She also conducted a qualitative research study on nurses who participate in disaster relief efforts, and her most recent research explores the experiences of parents whose children are transgender.

ABSN Courses

Students must complete 64 credits in general education and 56 credits in nursing, totaling 120 credits. Along with a solid foundation in nursing, graduates of the program will be eligible to sit for the National Council Licensure Examination (NCLEX-RN® Exam).

Admission Requirements

At UB, we pride ourselves on providing you with a quality, in-depth nursing education. Our program is rigorous, and our high volume of applicants means you must meet certain criteria to gain acceptance into the program. The requirements are as follows.

General admission requirements

- A conferred BS/BA degree from a fully accredited academic institution
- A "C+" or better in all math and science courses (including but not limited to Anatomy & Physiology I & II, Chemistry, and Algebra)
- Minimum cumulative GPA of 3.0 from all institutions attended in order to apply to the ABSN program
- Math and science coursework must be completed within seven years prior to applying to the ABSN Program
- ABSN pre-requisites include ENG101, MATH103, MATH203, PSYC103, PSYC205, SOCI101, BIOL113, BIOL114, BIOL106, and CHEM113
- HSCI 230 can be transferred in as a pre-requisite course
- All prerequisites must be completed before the first day of the first semester
- At the time of application, only 3 prerequisites may be outstanding or in progress
- Missing general education courses will be waived (i.e., Fine Arts and a 2nd Humanity)

Required materials

ABSN applicants must submit the following materials:

- Completed University of Bridgeport application
- Official high school transcripts or equivalent
- Transcripts from all colleges or universities previously attended
- 2 completed Recommendation Forms
 - Please review the Recommendation Form for specifics. Each recommendation form must be placed in a sealed envelope with the referrer's signature across the closure.
- Personal Essay of approximately 500 words
 - The personal essay helps us become acquainted with you as a person and demonstrates your ability to organize and express your thoughts. The essay may include what you know about the nursing profession, your experiences interacting with people, and your views on healthy living. You may also identify your career goals and plans for succeeding in the University of Bridgeport School of Nursing. Additionally, you may attach additional details of circumstances or qualifications not reflected in the application. The candidate should include their name, date, and signature on the statement.
