BS-MS in Human Nutrition

When you choose a concentration in Nutrition, you can begin your Human Nutrition degree during your senior year — returning for a fifth year to finish your MS studies.


A vibrant campus community

Earn your degree your way

At UB, you can tailor your Health Sciences degree with one of five concentration tracks. Through our Community Health Education and Nutrition tracks, you can choose to pursue a dual degree — earning your BS and master's degree in only five years.

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Community Health Education

Prepare for a career focused on protecting and promoting the health of underserved communities through health education and disease prevention activities. Our Community Health Education graduates achieve rewarding careers providing patient care and ingluencing health policy.

Through our Community Health Education track, eligible students can beging earning their master's in Public Health (MPH) during their senior year. After completing the remainign Health Sciences requirements, students spend a fifth year finishing their MPH.

Exercise and Fitness

With our Exercise and Fitness track, you'll gain the skills to develop appropriate fitness programs for people in your care. Graduates from this concentration pursue rewarding careers as personal trainers, health educations, and more.

Nutrition

In this program, you'll develop a deep understanding of the science behind nutrition — building the knowledge and skills necessary to analyze individual nutritional needs and educate diverse populations on the relationship between their food and overall health.

With a concentration in Nutrition, qualifying students can pursue their dual degree in Human Nutrition — beginning graduate-level classes during their senior year before returning for a fifth year to complete their MS studies.

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Pre-Physician Assistant

When you pursue the Pre-Physician Assistant concentration, you can develop the knowledge and skills necessary for applying to a Physician Assistant master's program after graduation. Please note that completing this track does not automatically grant you admission to UB's Physician Assistant program.

Pre-Professional

In this program, you'll develop a deep understanding of the factors that influence health. The Pre-Professional track prepares you to continue your health sciences education by obtaining your graduate degree in diverse fields.

6 Pre-Occupational Therapy

The Pre-Occupational Therapy (Pre-OT) concentration at University of Bridgeport prepares you with the skills and knowledge you'll need to pursue advanced degrees in occupational therapy (OT) and make a meaningful difference in your patients' lives.



Admission Requirements

- Complete the application for enrollment at bridgeport.edu/apply
- Submit transcripts
 - Submit proof of high school completion or its equivalent
 - Submit transcripts from all colleges and universities attended (transfer applicants)
- Students must have a minimum cumulative GPA of 2.5
- First-year students must submit a personal essay (optional if you choose to submit SAT/ACT scores)




Financial Aid
