UB’s flexible associate degree in Nursing (ADN) program is designed to fit into your busy life. Nursing classes are offered 2-3 evenings per week, and clinicals include day, evening, and weekend options, allowing you to earn your degree in a way that works best for your schedule. At UB, you can become an RN in as few as 20 months part-time.* You can also earn points towards your Nursing application by taking your prerequisites at UB!

In this program, you’ll develop the hands-on clinical skills and knowledge you need to provide care in a wide variety of healthcare settings, from hospitals and doctors’ clinics to rehabilitation centers and schools. With an emphasis on interprofessional healthcare, you’ll develop the communication skills, critical thinking, reasoning, and clinical judgement necessary to act as a liaison between patients, their families, and their healthcare team.
