#### Admission requirements

#### **Program prerequisites**

- Bachelor's degree from an accredited university or recognized international institution
- Cumulative undergraduate GPA of 3.0 or higher (will consider lower GPAs for highly qualified applicants)
- 9 credits in undergraduate psychology coursework with a grade of B or higher
  - 3 of the 9 credits may be in an area closely related to psychology
  - Applicants are recommended to have three undergraduate credits in either abnormal psychology or psychopathology
- Minimum of 6-9 months of field experience working in social service agencies, mental health professions, or substance use intervention sites

#### **Required materials**

- Complete the application for enrollment at bridgeport.edu/apply
- Official transcript for the last degree earned\*\*
- Resumé
  - For Clinical Mental Health Counseling applicants, significant experience in the field of counseling must be demonstrated
- Two letters of recommendation
  - Letters may come from employers, professors, or professional associates
- Personal statement
  - A 200-500 word personal statement detailing your interest in the counseling program, relevant academic and personal experience, and describe your professional plans
- Interview

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
