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# Prepare for career advancement in UB's Honors College

#### Eligibility

The Honors College is designed for students who demonstrate exceptional academic achievement. First-year accepted students with cumulative high school GPA of 3.0 or higher will be enrolled in the Honors College.

#### **New students**

First-year Honors College students will be registered for HONR 101F: First Year Seminar. In this class, students learn about the three different Honors tracks — Honors Scholar, Honors Leader, and Honors Citizen. In this class, students will actively explore each program track before ultimately making a decision to specialize.

#### **Transfer students**

Undergraduate students with a cumulative GPA of 3.0 or higher can apply for the Honors College before they've completed 60 credits.

### Requirements

Honors Leaders and Honors Citizens must:

- Maintain a cumulative GPA of 3.0 or higher
- Complete at least three Honors-designated courses with a minimum grade of "B"
- Conclude their Honors College experience with an Honors Campus Leadership or Honors Campus Citizenship project

Honors Scholars must:

- Maintain a cumulative GPA of 3.5 or higher
- Complete at least six Honors-designated courses with a minimum grade of "B"
- Conclude their Honors College education with an Honors thesis or research project

### Three distinct programs



### Honors Scholar

The Honors Scholar track is ideal for students who are motivated by academic success and achievement.

Honors Scholars are required to take HONR 395/397: Senior Thesis Independent Study to write an honors thesis with a faculty member and create a poster to submit to UB Rise.



### Honors Citizen

The Honors Citizen track is perfect for prospective students who are interested in developing and cultivating citizenship skills.

Honors Citizens are required to take HONR 392: Campus Citizenship Project, a class which prompts students to stage a civic engagement activity to address a particular social issue.



### Honors Leader

The Honors Leader program invites students who are concerned about social interests and motivated by community building and service learning.

Honors Leaders are required to take HONR 391: Campus Leadership Project, a class in which students create a new campus organization, event, or significantly improve an already existing one.
