Bridgeport's Brightest Program

Empowering local graduates

The Bridgeport's Brightest program is designed to make higher education more accessible and affordable for Bridgeport public high school graduates. By participating in this program, UB commits to you paying \$7,000 in tuition if you are a commuter student or \$12,500 for tuition and room and board if you are living on campus per year.¹ Students who take advantage of this program are still eligible for additional grants and scholarships, clearing a path to a UB education for students in our local community.

Transforming futures — together

Bridgeport's Brightest is a four-year renewable program that is the result of a collaborative partnership between University of Bridgeport and Bridgeport Public Schools. Recognizing the challenges students face in opening the door to higher education, UB and Bridgeport Public Schools worked together to provide a solution that supports students' access to financial aid. The Bridgeport's Brightest program aims to ensure equitable access to higher education for Bridgeport's public high school students.

How it works

The Bridgeport's Brightest program is made possible through a combination of grants, scholarships, and institutional aid. This program aligns with our mission to empower local students — fostering academic success, professional achievement, and community impact.

Fall 2025 Bridgeport's Brightest program requirements:

This program is limited to the first 50 applicants who meet the following criteria. The student must:

- Be a graduate from a Bridgeport public high school
- Enroll in a full-time, on-campus degree program at UB
- Have a minimum cumulative GPA of 2.5
 - Students with a GPA below a 2.5 will be reviewed by UB's Admissions team.
- Have completed the FAFSA (Free Application for Federal Student Aid), including all financial aid elements, and participate in a financial literacy appointment
 - In place of the FAFSA, DACA students will work directly with Student Financial Services

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Admission Requirements

- Complete the application for enrollment at: bridgeport.edu/apply
- Submit transcripts
 - Submit proof of high school completion or its equivalent
 - Submit transcripts from all colleges/ universities attended (transfer applicants)
- Students must have a minimum cumulative GPA of 2.5
- First-year students must submit a personal essay (optional if you choose to submit SAT/ACT scores)
