#### Step 3: Submit your FAFSA

You must submit your Federal Application for Student Aid (FAFSA) each year to remain eligible for grants and federal student loans. Grants help lower your educational costs and don't require repayment. Student loans, which will require repayment, can help bridge any financial gaps.

Types of grants available include:

- University of Bridgeport Grant
- Pell Grant
- Supplemental Educational Opportunity Grant (SEOG)

Types of loans available include:

- Stafford Loans\*\*
- Direct Parent PLUS Loans

#### Your FAFSA checklist

Ready to begin your FAFSA? Use this checklist to stay ahead in the application process.

- Confirm UB has your social security number by contacting Admissions at 203-576-4552
  - This is how the University connects your FAFSA with your UB application
- Create an FSA ID at studentaid.gov
  - Write down your username and password so you can access the FAFSA form when it's available
- Once available, complete the FAFSA at studentaid.gov
- Use UB's school code: 001416



## **Admission requirements**

- Complete your free UB application at bridgeport.edu/apply
- Submit proof of high school completion or its equivalent (this will typically be a transcript provided by your school counseling office)
- Submit transcripts from all colleges and universities attended (transfer applicants)
- Submit a personal essay or SAT/ACT scores
- UB is test optional! If you choose not to submit SAT/ ACT scores, you can complete a personal essay
