Getting accommodations you need to succeed

At UB, we're committed to providing services to qualified students with disabilities. You deserve accommodations that provide you with equal access to your education. SAS staff are available to help you navigate the process of determining if you qualify for reasonable accommodation.

How can we help?

Receiving accommodations is an interactive process. Your thoughts and opinions are considered, along with your medical provider's recommendations. We will work with you to develop reasonable accommodations that provide equal access to educational opportunities and UB campus life.

Who is eligible?

Accomodations are reviewed on an individual basis. Documentation must indicate that a disability exists and limits one or more major life activities. A diagnosis of a disability does not automatically qualify an individual for accommodations.

Examples of academic accommodations include:

- Accessible classroom materials
- Accessible housing
- Extended time for testing
- Special testing accommodations such as proctoring services
- And more

Important information

Accommodations are not a guarantee for success. Accommodations promote non-discrimination and equitable access to opportunities. You must still meet course requirements and complete assignments. Accommodations are determined through an established review process based on documentation regarding a student's disability. The law does not require institutions to waive specific courses or academic requirements considered essential to a particular program or degree. UB will facilitate academic adjustments on a case-by-case basis to ensure that students are not discriminated against on the basis of their disability.
