You can earn certification in business, English, history and social studies, mathematics, music (PK-12), science (biology, chemistry, earth science, general science, and physics), or computer science and gain invaluable teaching experience in the classroom that will prepare you to empower the next generation. We work with more than 60 districts throughout Connecticut and New York to provide you with practical experiences in a local school. This program is conveniently offered at both our Bridgeport and Waterbury locations.

Your graduate education is covered with a tuition-paid internship

Thanks to partnerships with school districts across the state, paid internship opportunities are available that will almost entirely offset the tuition cost for your master's degree, allowing you to complete the program without taking on the burden of additional student loans.

Tuition-paid internship model

- Take classes 2-3 evenings a week
- UB's School of Education arranges your internship placement
- Intern full-time in a cooperating school during the day for an entire academic year
- Pay only for books and fees
- Complete your master's degree in as few as 15 months

Course requirements

- 9 credit hours in foundations of education coursework
 - Differentiated Instruction
 - Educational Psychology
 - Special Education
- 24 hours of professional education requirements
 - content subject areas
 - curriculum and methods of teaching
 - statutory state requirements
 - field experiences
- 60-70 day (12-14 week) student teaching experience (6 credit hours)

Program prerequisites

- Bachelor's degree from a regionally accredited university or recognized international institution
 - A master's degree from a regionally accredited university is required for the 6th year program
 - Cumulative undergraduate grade point average of 2.67 ('B-') or higher

Graduate applicants are required to submit:

- Application at bridgeport.edu/apply
- Official transcripts from each institution attended
 - International transcripts must include an official course-by-course evaluation of all academic work from www.naces.org
- Letter of recommendation
 - Letter needs to come from an employer, professor or professional associate and must testify to your suitability as a prospective teacher
- Personal statement
 - In 350 words or more, detail the reasons you are interested in enrolling in the certification program of your choice, highlight relevant background experiences and address your overall professional goals in the teaching profession. Please discuss any activities, general or professional, that have influenced your decision to enter the teaching profession.
- Resumé

 - Personal audition or interview with the program director
